On 3-6 October 1972 in Wiesbaden, Federal Republic of Germany, the EPS will hold its second General Conference which will be organized jointly with the German Physical Society. During the Conference a physics exhibition will be held to show participants the latest developments of devices and instrumentation in physics and to encourage contacts between physicists in research, teaching and development.

The theme of the scientific programme is 'Trends in Physics', and the Conference is planned to give a broad review of the present and the future of physics. In addition to the research fields covered by existing Specialized Divisions of the EPS, time has been allocated in the programme to related fields that are of rapidly growing interest to physicists as, for instance, modern biophysics and geophysics of the atmosphere, and even to fields as remote as the applications of physical methods to economics.

Throughout the Conference two aspects will predominate: One is the application of fundamental physics to modern technology, which will be underlined in plenary and divisional sessions, and special talks will be devoted to recent technological developments. The other is the close interrelation of physics and society. Special morning and evening sessions will be allocated to the discussion of science policy, funding of research and the employment situation in Europe. The role of the physicist and his public image will be illustrated in the context of the physicists' responsibility towards society.

The general aim of the Conference is to give the active physicist an insight into the trends of physics in research and teaching, even outside his specific domain of activity. The organizers hope that the conference will stimulate the participants to think about the relevance of their activities. The organizers are aiming to attract young physicists in addition to active

research scientists in order to achieve a fruitful interchange of views covering a wide range of fields.

The Programme Committee decided to have plenary sessions in the mornings and evenings and five parallel divisional sessions on each of three afternoons. On Wednesday afternoon, 4 October 1972, the plenary talk will be followed by the General Assembly of Ordinary Members of the European Physical Society.

Society's First President Honoured

The Governing Board of the American Institute of Physics has named Professor **G. Bernardini** as the third recipient of the John Torrence Tate Gold Medal for 'distinguished service to the profession of physics'. The Gold Medal is awarded approximately every five years and is accompanied by a certificate and a cheque for US \$ 1000. Gilberto Bernardini, the first President of the EPS, was especially recognized in the award for his 'efforts as the guiding spirit in the creation of the European Physical Society'. He is to receive his award at the 50th Anniversary Meeting of the General Assembly of the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics in Washington, DC, on 21 September 1972.
