Trends in Physics

The programme facing participants attending the second EPS General Conference in Wiesbaden from 3-6 October will provide them with four days of intense activity from which they should return to their laboratories recharged with enthusiasm.

For those physicists who feel in need of insight into domains removed from their own specialities, there are the fifteen plenary lectures in the mornings and evenings. Others will have come to Wiesbaden to attend the sessions arranged by the Specialized Divisions of EPS, where they will be discussing the problems at the frontiers of physics. Apart from the scientific programmes, there is a special discussion on present policy and current prospects for physics, arranged by the EPS Advisory Committee on Physics and Society, for 3 October at 20.00 hours.

Other important EPS activities are the General Assembly Meeting on 4 October to which all Ordinary Members have been invited, and the Meeting with EPS Associate Members, also on 4 October.

An essential part of the Wiesbaden Conference organized by the German Physical Society is the associated Physics Exhibition which boasts no fewer than 83 exhibitors. Here participants will be able to see the latest devices and instrumentation which will reinforce the Conference's aim to provide a view of the trends in physics. In addition to these attractions to physicists, the social programme is so varied that it is almost worth going to Wiesbaden for that alone!

No doubt the Chairman of the Programme Committee, Professor Dr. W. Martienssen, and of the Local Organizing Committee, U. Dihle, will

be pleased that the Conference has now arrived, since the major load has fallen on their shoulders. Conference participants will look forward to benefiting from their efforts.
