The fourth in the series of EPS Industrial Workshop is on 'Ion Beams in Materials'. It will be held at the Physikzentrum, Bad Honnef in the FRG from 11-13 October 1989. Titles of the five sessions are:

New trends in ion implantation;
ion beam assisted deposition and surface modification of metals;
ion beam synthesis and ion beam mixing;
Particle beam analysis;
Ion-solid interaction.

The aim of this Workshop is to bring together about 50 experts from industry and the universities to study the potential and future of ion beam processing and its relevance to the market place. Special areas of interest will be examined with emphasis on collaboration.

The Workshop is primarily designed for EPS Associate Members and universities, but applications from outside these categories will be considered. Fee including board and lodging is DM 400.- for staff of Associate Members and IOMs; DM 800.- for others; university speakers may apply for special consideration.
